# Fundraising Report....2018 Oyster Roast

As always, the Fundraising Committee is, and has been, hard at work. The Eleventh Annual Oyster Roast is the major topic for this report. What a night we had? Approximately 475 people gathered at the Selby Farm Shop east of Bath to enjoy an evening of eating, raffling, auctioning, and enjoying each other's company.



*Jerol Selby* and his crew had once more done a wonderful job to have the shop all ready for business and the cooking area set up and ready to go. Each year Jerol comes up with a

new innovation to make the steaming process more efficient. This year was no exception; *Mark Keyzer* had shared the idea of warming boxes, and Jerol wasted no time to make that happen. Thanks to this new discovery,

oysters were waiting for the earliest customers, and no one had to wait for their food of choice. The usual seafood gumbo, chili, hot dogs, desserts, cheese and crackers, wine, beer, soft drinks, beer and



water flowed in abundance. Our patrons left with a smile on their faces and plenty of food in their bodies. A tremendous word of appreciation to these customers who helped to make this event such a success.

Some of the very interesting details about the Oyster Roast to help our readers understand the difficulty of this project but the many people who help to make it a success.

Eighty-nine volunteers donated 455 hours to complete all the necessary tasks. In-kind donations totaled \$6625.





In addition to food, the other parts of the Oyster Roast included the raffle for a beautiful silver golf cart, thanks to the assistance of *Wayne and Candy Howell of A* 

& W Sales; a very successful silent auction, a 50/50 drawing, and delicious homemade desserts. The total profits from this project were approximately \$22,000.



The next opportunity to have to add to the treasury is the Bake Sale in conjunction with Bath Fest on May 19. We will have a booth where people can purchase some of the best baked goods anywhere around. *Terry Woolard and Celestia Carson* help to head this project, and they would love for you to donate baked goods or to stop by and purchase something from our booth.

On May 26 we will have our annual Yard Sale. Once again the Town of Bath is graciously allowing us to use the Old BHS Gym to show our wares. The sale will take place from 7:00 am until 10:30 am. If you have items you would like to donate to the sale, you may deliver them to the gym each day that week Monday, May 21 thru Thursday, May 24 during the hours of 9:00 am until 12:00 noon and 5:00 pm until 7:00 pm. We look forward to having all of you shop with us on the 26<sup>th</sup>.
