# The Case of the Missing Fountain Bowl by Peggy Daw

For many years, a beautiful water fountain graced the BHS courtyard. A photo of the fountain was taken around 2014, by Larry Boyd and framed copies were sold at BHSP fundraising events. However, the fountain fell into disrepair and between 2016-2020 the bowl was removed for safekeeping and taken to June Wallace's storage area to be kept with other memorabilia. During planning for the Centennial Celebration in 2021, several families and groups asked about making a special donation to BHSP to repair the plumbing and restore the water fountain.



In October, Claudia Alligood asked June Wallace about getting the bowl back to start the restoration process. June told Claudia that Ricky Carawan (Building Committee volunteer/chair 2016-2020), had picked it up and, as June understood it, his plan was to take the bowl to the school for storage. However, when the subject of the bowl came up at the last BHSP meeting, everyone at the meeting --past presidents, multiple board members and volunteers, all who have consistently been onsite -- said they had not seen the fountain bowl in storage at the school.
