## *In Loving Memory Of Jack Lloyd Wallace*



**OCTOBER 27, 1927~ NOVEMBER 6, 2018**

*Son, Brother, Student, Athlete, Soldier, Educator, Coach, Principal, Husband, Dad, Papa, Mentor, & Friend*

The experience stayed with him for the rest of his life, grateful that he survived the war but never able to get out of his mind the things he experienced in Korea.



Following discharge he returned to Bath to be with family and had plans to go to Salisbury, NC where a coaching job was waiting. The principal of Bath High School asked him to substitute teach for him a few days and the rest is history. He stayed at BHS 43 years. He taught social studies and assisted the coach, Fred Brady coaching Football, Basketball, and Baseball. The following year he became head coach of all three sports.

Fiercely competitive he wanted no part of losing! There were few to none losing seasons in any of the sports, winning local, conference, district, and state championships. 3 State Champs in Football and 1 in Baseball.

During this time he served on the Board of the North Carolina High School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) for 10 years, serving a term as President. After fifteen years of teaching and coaching, he became Principal of Bath High School, a K-12 school. "*Coach*" gave up his coaching but his passion for the education and well being of the many students who attended BHS and BES never faltered.

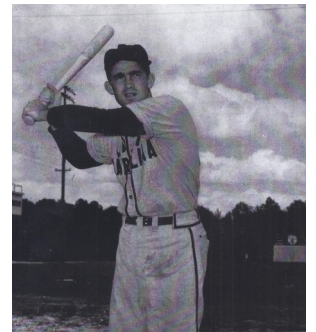

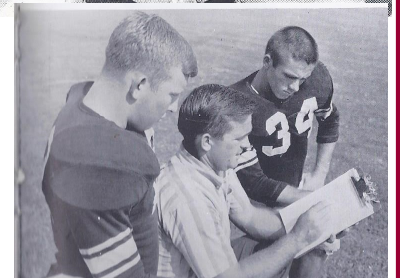
*Mr. Jack Wallace* had a deep love for the Bath community and the school. He never failed to brag that Bath School was the best school in NC, with the best students, staff, and people anywhere.

*Jack Lloyd Wallace* was born October 27, 1927 on a farm in the Bath community where he also grew up with his nine siblings. He received from his parents, Will and Delia Wallace, the tremendous moral constitution that was the strength of his life. During his childhood he worked on the farm and baseball was king and a favorite past time for him. As a young boy he played with the Beaufort County League and excelled as a hitter. He graduated from Bath High School in 1945 and joined the Merchant Marines with two goals in mind-saving his money in order to attend college and play baseball.

He enrolled in East Carolina College in 1947 after two years in the Merchant Marines. He was the first player at ECC to be awarded a baseball scholarship. In 1951 he graduated with degrees in Social Studies and Physical Education. It was at this time he signed with the Chicago Cubs to play professional baseball. That summer he played AAA baseball and had a contract to play the next year. After his summer stint of AAA ball he came home to Bath and within a week was drafted into the Army at a time when the Korean War was raging. A career of professional baseball wasn't meant to be. He was sent to Korea where he stayed 16 months on the front line and came back a decorated soldier.

Meanwhile there was a home life. He didn't realize back in 1945 there was more to life than college and baseball! In 1956 he married the love of his life, June Brinn Wallace. Together they had two daughters, Jenni Wallace Uzzell, husband Lemmie Uzzell, children Rachel Brinn Uzzell and Jack Uzzell. Gina Wallace Hull, husband Robert Hull, children Greyson Willa Hull and Avery June Hull. His grandchildren learned a lifetime of wisdom during the

It meant so much to him to save the school building that had molded so many from the Bath area and to preserve their heritage.

An icon was lost that fateful day but we are thankful for our memories. We are all better off for having known **Jack Lloyd Wallace**.



## President's Message...



Since this is my last President's message for *"The Pirate's Revenge"*, it's given me time to reminisce over the last 4 years. My time as President of BHSP began in June 2015. It didn't take me long to realize it truly does take a village to assist the board. Their help and expertise has gotten us to where we are today and will be needed continuously throughout until the project is completed. Our largest project yet to be done is the renovation of the auditorium space. A bit of good news came in March regarding the possibility of some major help with that project.

In March we were delighted when Gov. Roy Cooper included in his proposed budget, \$560,000 for renovations to the Bath High School auditorium. Much hard work remains to make sure this is included in the final budget that the General Assembly will ultimately pass. Key legislators have been contacted and we will be asking for help from our members as we progress. The Historic Bath Foundation and other local organizations are working with us in this effort. The Town of Bath has passed a resolution of support and we are working to get other public statements of support of this grant. We are confident that Bath High School Preservation and the Historic Bath Foundation can fulfill the requirement of \$1 to be raised locally for every \$4 in state funds should they be granted.

At this writing, the legislature is just starting its handling of the state budget, so the fate of the project is uncertain. Be assured the Bath High School Preservation board will work hard with our partners to do all we can to win funding for this important project.

In closing, I'd like to thank each and every one of you that has helped to make my tenure as president a worthwhile and gratifying experience. You have given freely of your time, your talents, your expertise and your dollars and I am grateful for each of you. Thank you to my fellow officers and board members past and present-I could not have done this job without your continued assistance and most importantly your encouragement. Last, but not least-a very special thank you to my husband who has been my champion, my sounding board and my number one supporter these four years. Although I will be handing over the *"gavel"* to a new president in June, I will continue to support BHSP and it's worthwhile mission in anyway possible.

**Editor's Note:** It has been a real pleasure working with you during the past four years as President of BHSP. I've so enjoyed getting to know you better and to observe your dedication and hard work toward the Bath High School project. The good thing about you is that you may step down but you will not step away. You'll be right there helping out like you have done so many times before through thick and thin. The new President will definitely be rewarded by having you to lean on as the "past" president.
